December 16, 2000

Data: 8 observers in 6 parties, 47.5 party hours, 399.5 party miles.

Weather: Overcast, moderate rain in AM, fog & scattered light rain in PM. Wind SE @ 5 - 30 mph, 34 - 40°F.
12" snow on ground. Still water partly open, moving water partly frozen. Wild food crop fair.
